#### NAME

fc-scan - scan font files or directories

#### SYNOPSIS

```
fc-scan [ -Vh ]  
[ [ -f format ] [ --format format ] ] [ --version ] [ --help ] file...
```

#### DESCRIPTION

fc-scan scans file(s) recursively and prints out font pattern for each face found.

#### OPTIONS

This program follows the usual GNU command line syntax, with long options starting with two dashes ('-'). A summary of options is included below.

**-f** Format output according to the format specifier format.

**-V** Show version of the program and exit.

**-h** Show summary of options.

**file** Scan file recursively for font faces.

#### RETURN CODES

fc-scan returns error code 0 if at least one font was found or 1 otherwise.
