NAME

catanh, catanhf, catanhl - complex arc tangents hyperbolic

SYNOPSIS

#include <complex.h>

double complex catanh(double complex z);

float complex catanhf(float complex z);

long double complex catanhl(long double complex z);

Link with -lm.

DESCRIPTION

These functions calculate the complex arc hyperbolic tangent of z. If $y = \text{catanh}(z)$, then $z = \text{ctanh}(y)$. The imaginary part of y is chosen in the interval $[-\pi/2, \pi/2]$.

One has:

$$\text{catanh}(z) = 0.5 * (\text{clog}(1 + z) - \text{clog}(1 - z))$$

VERSIONS

These functions first appeared in glibc in version 2.1.

    }
    z = atof(argv[1]) + atof(argv[2]) * I;
    c = catanh(z);
    printf("catanh() = %6.3f %6.3f*i\n", creal(c), cimag(c));
    f = 0.5 * (clog(1 + z) - clog(1 - z));
    printf("formula = %6.3f %6.3f*i\n", creal(f2), cimag(f2));
    exit(EXIT_SUCCESS);
}
