NAME

git-sh-i18n--envsubst - Git's own envsubst(1) for i18n fallbacks

SYNOPSIS

```
eval_gettext () {  
    printf "%s" "$1" | (  
        export PATH $(git sh-i18n--envsubst --variables "$1");  
        git sh-i18n--envsubst "$1"  
    )  
}
```

DESCRIPTION

This is not a command the end user would want to run. Ever. This documentation is meant for people who are studying the plumbing scripts and/or are writing new ones. `git sh-i18n--envsubst` is Git's stripped-down copy of the GNU `envsubst(1)` program that comes with the GNU `gettext` package. It's used internally by `git-sh-i18n(1)` to interpolate the variables passed to the `eval_gettext` function.

No promises are made about the interface, or that this program won't disappear without warning in the next version of Git. Don't use it.
