### NAME

wcschr - search a wide character in a wide-character string

### SYNOPSIS

```
#include <wchar.h>
```

```
wchar_t *wcschr(const wchar_t *wcs, wchar_t wc);
```

### DESCRIPTION

The `wcschr()` function is the wide-character equivalent of the `strchr(3)` function.

It searches the first occurrence of `wc` in the wide-character string pointed to by

`wcs`.

### RETURN VALUE

The `wcschr()` function returns a pointer to the first occurrence of `wc` in the wide-character string pointed to by `wcs`, or `NULL` if `wc` does not occur in the string.
