Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Clear-AssignedAccess'

PS:\>Get-HELP Clear-AssignedAccess -Full

NAME

Clear-AssignedAccess

SYNOPSIS

Clears assigned access configured account settings.

SYNTAX

Clear-AssignedAccess [-Confirm] [-WhatIf] [<CommonParameters>]

DESCRIPTION

The Clear-AssignedAccess cmdlet clears assigned access configured account settings and returns the user to default settings.

If a user is signed-in or the computer has a PS/2 keyboard, you must restart the computer to apply the changes.

Assigned Access cmdlets are supported on Windows 10 and Windows 11 client operating systems only.

PARAMETERS

-Confirm [<SwitchParameter>]

Prompts you for confirmation before running the cmdlet.
