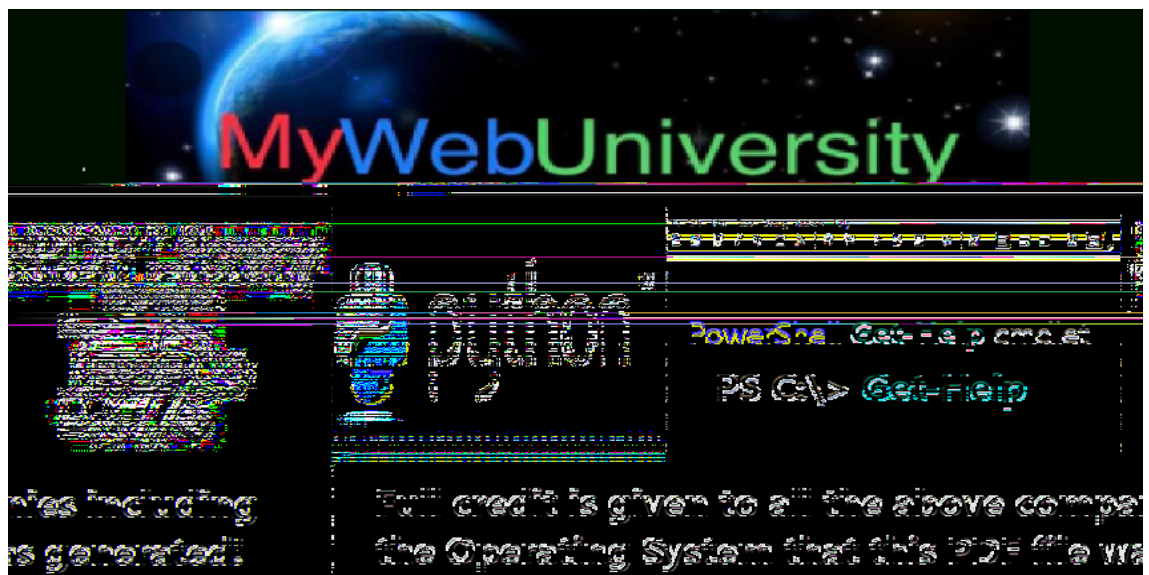




Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Get-AzMediaServiceNameAvailability'

The Get-AzMediaServiceNameAvailability cmdlet checks whether a media service name is available. Media service names are globally unique.

```
