```
$VMCustomScriptExtension = Get-AzVMCustomScriptExtension -ResourceGroupName "ResourceGroup11" -VMName  
"VirtualMachine07" -Name "ContosoCustomScript"
```

This command gets the custom script extension named ContosoCustomScript for the virtual machine named VirtualMachine07.

Example 2: Get the instance view of a custom script extension

```
$VMCustomScriptExtension = Get-AzVMCustomScriptExtension -ResourceGroupName "ResourceGroup11" -VMName  
"VirtualMachine07" -Name "ContosoCustomScript" -Status
```

This command gets the instance view of the custom script extension named ContosoCustomScript for the virtual machine named VirtualMachine07.
