



Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'New-AzPublicIpTag'

PS:\>Get-HELP New-AzPublicIpTag -Full

----- Example 1: Create a new IP Tag -----

```
$ipTag = New-AzPublicIpTag -IpTagType $ipTagType -Tag $tag
```

This command creates a new IP Tag with the Tagtype like "FirstPartyUsage" and tag like "/Sql". This is used in publicIpAddress creation with these specific tags for allocation.
