DESCRIPTION

The Remove-AzAutomationConnectionType cmdlet removes a connection type from Azure Automation. All connections that are associated with the connection type that you delete become unusable. Remove them, unless you create a new connection type that meets the following criteria: - The type has the same name as the original connection type.

- The type has the same field definitions as the original connection type.

It can have additional fields.

```

This command removes a connection type named ContosoConnectionType in the Automation account named Contoso17.
