



## ***Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Remove-AzEnvironment'***

***PS:\>Get-HELP Remove-AzEnvironment -Full***

### NAME

Remove-AzEnvironment

### SYNOPSIS

Removes endpoints and metadata for connecting to a given Azure instance.

### SYNTAX

```

Remove-AzEnvironment [-Name] <System.String> [-DefaultProfile
<Microsoft.Azure.Commands.Common.Authentication.Abstractions.Core.IAzureContextContainer>] [-Scope
{Process | CurrentUser}] [-Confirm] [-WhatIf] [<CommonParameters>]

```

### DESCRIPTION

The Remove-AzEnvironment cmdlet removes endpoints and metadata information for connecting to a given Azure instance.

### PARAMETERS

-DefaultProfile <Microsoft.Azure.Commands.Common.Authentication.Abstractions.Core.IAzureContextContainer>

The credentials, tenant and subscription used for communication with azure.

-Name <System.String>

Specifies the name of the environment to remove.

-Scope <Microsoft.Azure.Commands.Profile.Common.ContextModificationScope>

Determines the scope of context changes, for example, whether changes apply only to the current process, or to all sessions started by this user.

-Confirm <System.Management.Automation.SwitchParameter>

Prompts you for confirmation before running the cmdlet.

#### -WhatIf <System.Management.Automation.SwitchParameter>

Shows what would happen if the cmdlet runs. The cmdlet is not run.

```
Add-AzEnvironment -Name TestEnvironment `
  -ActiveDirectoryEndpoint TestADEndpoint `
  -ActiveDirectoryServiceEndpointResourceId TestADApplicationId `
  -ResourceManagerEndpoint TestRMEndpoint `
  -GalleryEndpoint TestGalleryEndpoint `
  -GraphEndpoint TestGraphEndpoint
```
