



Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Remove-AzExpressRoutePort'

PS:\>Get-HELP Remove-AzExpressRoutePort -Full

----- Example 1 -----

Remove-AzExpressRoutePort -Name \$PortName -ResourceGroupName \$rg

Removes \$PortName ExpressRoutePort resource in \$rg resource group in your subscription.

----- Example 2 -----

```
Remove-AzExpressRoutePort -InputObject $Port
```

Removes the ExpressRoutePort resource in InputObject.

----- Example 3 -----

```
Remove-AzExpressRoutePort -ResourceId $Id
```

Removes the ExpressRoutePort resource with ResourceId \$Id.
