



Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Remove-AzExpressRoutePortIdentity'

PS:\>Get-HELP Remove-AzExpressRoutePortIdentity -Full

DESCRIPTION

The Remove-AzExpressRoutePortIdentity cmdlet removes identity from a local Azure ExpressRoutePort object. Use Remove-AzExpressRoutePort to remove it to from

ExpressRoutePort.
