The Remove-AzManagedApplication cmdlet removes a managed application

PARAMETERS

-ApiVersion <System.String>

When set, indicates the version of the resource provider API to use. If not specified, the API version is automatically determined as the latest available.

----- Example 1: Remove managed application by resource ID -----

```
$Application = Get-AzManagedApplication -Name "myApp" -ResourceGroupName "myRG"
```

```
Remove-AzManagedApplication -Id $Application.ResourceId -Force
```

The first command gets a managed application named myApp by using the Get-AzManagedApplication cmdlet. The command stores it in the \$Application variable. The second

command removes the managed application identified by the ResourceId property of \$Application.
