



Windows PowerShell Get-Help on Cmdlet 'Remove-AzServiceEndpointPolicy'

PS: \> Get-HELP Remove-AzServiceEndpointPolicy -Full

--- Example 1: Removes a service endpoint policy using name ---

```
Remove-AzServiceEndpointPolicy -Name "Policy1" -ResourceGroupName "resourcegroup1"
```

This command removes a service endpoint policy with name Policy1 which belongs to resourcegroup with name "resourcegroup1"

Example 2: Remove a service endpoint policy using input object

```
Remove-AzServiceEndpointPolicy -InputObject $Policy1
```

This command removes a service endpoint policy object Policy1 which belongs to resourcegroup with name "resourcegroup1"
