INPUTOBJECT <IPolicyExemption>:

ExemptionCategory <String>: The policy exemption category. Possible values are Waiver and Mitigated.

PolicyAssignmentId <String>: The ID of the policy assignment that is being exempted.

[AssignmentScopeValidation <String>]: The option whether validate the exemption is at or under the assignment scope.

[Description <String>]: The description of the policy exemption.

[DisplayName <String>]: The display name of the policy exemption.

[ExpiresOn <DateTime?>]: The expiration date and time (in UTC ISO 8601 format yyyy-MM-ddTHH:mm:ssZ) of the policy exemption.

[Metadata <IPolicyExemptionPropertiesMetadata>]: The policy exemption metadata. Metadata is an open ended object and is typically a collection of key value pairs.

[(Any) <Object>]: This indicates any property can be added to this object.
