SYNOPSIS

Writes the data from an active DTC transactions trace session into the log file.

SYNTAX

Write-DtcTransactionsTraceSession [-AsJob] [-CimSession <CimSession[]>] [-ThrottleLimit <Int32>] [<CommonParameters>]

DESCRIPTION

The Write-DtcTransactionsTraceSession cmdlet writes the data from an active Distributed Transaction Coordinator (DTC) transactions trace session into the log file. If

there is no active session, this cmdlet exits.

PARAMETERS

Runs the cmdlet as a background job. Use this parameter to run commands that take a long time to complete.

The cmdlet immediately returns an object that represents the job and then displays the command prompt. You can continue to work in the session while the job

completes. To manage the job, use the `*-Job` cmdlets. To get the job results, use the Receive-Job (https://go.microsoft.com/fwlink/?LinkID=113372)cmdlet.
