## DESCRIPTION

All of the functions described on this page are deprecated.

Applications should instead use the OSSL\_PROVIDER APIs.

EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD is a structure which holds a set of methods for a specific public key cryptographic algorithm. Those methods are usually used to perform different jobs, such as generating a key, signing or verifying, encrypting or decrypting, etc.

There are two places where the EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD objects are stored: one is a built-in static array representing the standard methods for different algorithms, and the other one is a stack of user-defined application-specific methods, which can be manipulated by using EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_add0(3).

The EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD objects are usually referenced by EVP\_PKEY\_CTX objects.

## Methods

The methods are the underlying implementations of a particular public key algorithm present by the `EVP_PKEY_CTX` object.

The `init()` method is called to initialize algorithm-specific data when a new `EVP_PKEY_CTX` is created. As opposed to `init()`, the `cleanup()` method is called when an `EVP_PKEY_CTX` is freed. The `copy()` method is called when an `EVP_PKEY_CTX` is being duplicated. Refer to `EVP_PKEY_CTX_new(3)`, `EVP_PKEY_CTX_new_id(3)`, `EVP_PKEY_CTX_free(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_CTX_dup(3)`.

The `paramgen_init()` and `paramgen()` methods deal with key parameter generation. They are called by `EVP_PKEY_paramgen_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_paramgen(3)` to handle the parameter generation process.

The `sign_init()` and `sign()` methods are used to generate the signature of a piece of data using a private key. They are called by `EVP_PKEY_sign_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_sign(3)`.

The `verify_init()` and `verify()` methods are used to verify whether a

signature is valid. They are called by `EVP_PKEY_verify_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_verify(3)`.

The `verify_recover_init()` and `verify_recover()` methods are used to verify a signature and then recover the digest from the signature (for instance, a signature that was generated by RSA signing algorithm).

They are called by `EVP_PKEY_verify_recover_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_verify_recover(3)`.

The `decrypt_init()` and `decrypt()` methods are used to decrypt a piece of data. They are called by `EVP_PKEY_decrypt_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_decrypt(3)`.

The `derive_init()` and `derive()` methods are used to derive the shared secret from a public key algorithm (for instance, the DH algorithm).

They are called by `EVP_PKEY_derive_init(3)` and `EVP_PKEY_derive(3)`.

The `digest_custom()` method is used to generate customized digest content before the real message is passed to functions like `EVP_DigestSignUpdate(3)` or `EVP_DigestVerifyInit(3)`. This is usually required by some public key signature algorithms like SM2 which requires a hashed prefix to the message to be signed. The

digest\_custom() function will be called by EVP\_DigestSignInit(3) and EVP\_DigestVerifyInit(3).

## Functions

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_new() creates and returns a new EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object, and associates the given id and flags. The following flags are supported:

EVP\_PKEY\_FLAG\_AUTOARGLEN

EVP\_PKEY\_FLAG\_SIGCTX\_CUSTOM

If an EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD is set with the EVP\_PKEY\_FLAG\_AUTOARGLEN flag, the maximum size of the output buffer will be automatically calculated or checked in corresponding EVP methods by the EVP framework. Thus the implementations of these methods don't need to care about handling the case of returning output buffer size by themselves. For details on the output buffer size, refer to EVP\_PKEY\_sign(3).

The EVP\_PKEY\_FLAG\_SIGCTX\_CUSTOM is used to indicate the signctx() method of an EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD is always called by the EVP framework while doing a digest signing operation by calling EVP\_DigestSignFinal(3).

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_free() frees an existing EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD pointed by pmeth.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_copy() copies an EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object from src to dst.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_find() finds an EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object with the id. This function first searches through the user-defined method objects and then the built-in objects.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_add0() adds pmeth to the user defined stack of methods.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_remove() removes an EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object added by EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_add0().

The EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_set functions set the corresponding fields of EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD structure with the arguments passed.

The EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_get functions get the corresponding fields of EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD structure to the arguments provided.

## RETURN VALUES

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_new() returns a pointer to a new EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object

or returns NULL on error.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_free() and EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_copy() do not return values.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_find() returns a pointer to the found EVP\_PKEY\_METHOD object or returns NULL if not found.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_add0() returns 1 if method is added successfully or 0 if an error occurred.

EVP\_PKEY\_meth\_remove() returns 1 if method is removed successfully or 0 if an error occurred.

## HISTORY
