NAME

catan, catanf, catanl - complex arc tangents

SYNOPSIS

```
#include <complex.h>
```

```
double complex catan(double complex z);
```

```
float complex catanf(float complex z);
```

```
long double complex catanl(long double complex z);
```

Link with -lm.

DESCRIPTION

These functions calculate the complex arc tangent of z . If $y = \text{catan}(z)$, then $z = \text{ctan}(y)$. The real part of y is chosen in the interval $[-\pi/2, \pi/2]$.

One has:

$$\text{catan}(z) = (\text{clog}(1 + i * z) - \text{clog}(1 - i * z)) / (2 * i)$$

VERSIONS

These functions first appeared in glibc in version 2.1.

    }
    z = atof(argv[1]) + atof(argv[2]) * I;
    c = catan(z);
    printf("catan() = %6.3f %6.3fi\n", creal(c), cimag(c));
    f = (clog(1 + i * z) - clog(1 - i * z)) / (2 * i);
    printf("formula = %6.3f %6.3fi\n", creal(f2), cimag(f2));
    exit(EXIT_SUCCESS);
}
