DESCRIPTION

These functions calculate the inverse hyperbolic sine of x; that is the value whose hyper-

bolic sine is x.

RETURN VALUE

On success, these functions return the inverse hyperbolic sine of x .

If x is a NaN, a NaN is returned.

If x is +0 (-0), +0 (-0) is returned.

If x is positive infinity (negative infinity), positive infinity (negative infinity) is re-turned.

ERRORS

No errors occur.
